Community... Lead by Trevor Young & Jill Dixon, we will examine the situations of those in Santa Barbara who experience addiction or homelessness–or both.

7/11 - Multicultural Community... Led by Ruben & Holly Gil, we'll gain insight into the largely Latino community in Santa Barbara with emphasis on what we may not see. Racism, immigration, gangs, and other concerns touch this demographic in ways that should propel our compassion and understanding.

7/18 - Mentally Ill Community... Lead by James Furrow (Fuller Seminary professor,

author and psychologist) and his son Colin Furrow (of our own SBCC family), we will look at the experience of living with mental illness in our community, and what tangible compassion looks like.

7/25 - Human Trafficking... Did you know we have a significant human trafficking problem? Because we are situated in a tourist town, we attract sex traffickers; because we have agriculture in North County, we are prone to trafficking abuses among field workers; and because we have a large wealthy population, we frequently see trafficking among domestic workers. Adelle Rodkey will help us identify the problem and learn how to respond.

8/1 - Elderly and Disabled Community...

While they are two different populations, the elderly and disabled often share in common the experience of being unintentionally marginalized.
